NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

Evening Report

World Health Organization has declared the recent Novel Corona virus, COVID-19 as **Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC)** which has affected **206 countries/territories** including India till date. WHO has characterized COVID-19 as a **Pandemic** on 11th March 2020.

In this context, Karnataka state has strengthened all surveillance and containment measures against the possible spread of disease.

“As of 5 pm of 3rd April 2020, 128 COVID-19 positive cases have been confirmed in the state which includes 3 deaths & 11 discharges”

Out of 114, 111 COVID-19 positive patients (including 1 pregnant woman) are in isolation at designated hospitals are stable and three *in ICU* (P43 on oxygen and P101 & P102 on Ventilators).

4 new cases have been confirmed in the state of Karnataka from 02.04.2020 5.00pm to 03.04.2020 5.00pm.

| 2) | A circular No.DHS/SSU/Covid-19/17/2019-20 dated 02.04.2020 on Standard Operating Procedures for Senior Officers involved in decision making / planning / coordinating at district level – in a scenario of them testing positive for COVID-19 has been issued from the Commissionerate, Health & Family Welfare Services. |
| 3) | In order to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the Government of India has announced a lock-down, to provide the necessary freight and services, the concerned personnel and organisations should avail clear pass from Karnataka State Police. . | 4) | In 31 Fever Clinics of BBMP, in total 232 people have been screened on 02.04.2020 and till on date 1281 people have been screened. |
| 5) | Home Quarantine Enforcement squad have quarantined 48 persons in institutions yesterday based on the complaints received from public & totally till date 341 have been shifted from home Quarantine to institutional quarantine. |
| 6) | The positive cases and suspects hospitalized in the designated hospitals and quarantined persons will be staying there for a minimum period of 14 days or till the successive samples of the positive case are proved negative or as per the treating physicians advice. This long duration of stay in isolation requires a mental booster for keeping oneself calm & quite. Foreseeing this department has arranged for mental health counseling of such patients and contacts 1893 sessions were held on 02.04.2020 and so far 20,344 number of counseling sessions have been held. |

210 lines have been reserved for receiving calls of COVID-19 on 02.04.2020 calls 17,321 have been received and around 21,055 calls have outgone along with 23 manual calls has been done, for whom necessary guidance has been provided.

Appeal to Public: Any person who has returned from COVID-19 affected countries or has been in personal contact with such person must remain in home isolation for 14 days from arrival in India irrespective of having any symptoms or not. Also, should self-notify to nearest government hospital or call 104 health helpline. Maintain personal hygiene, use tissue paper/handkerchief while coughing or sneezing, frequently wash hands with soap and water or hand sanitizer and avoid attending mass social gatherings.
