World Health Organization has declared the recent Novel Coronavirus, COVID-19 as **Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC)** which has affected **105countries/territories** including India till date.

In this context, Karnataka state has strengthened all surveillance and containment measures against the possible spread of disease

Till date **95,151 passengers** have been screened in Karnataka. The details of points of entry are as follows.

- 1. KIA Airport Bengaluru –64,343 passengers cumulative (2,758 Screened yesterday)
- 2. Mangalore International airport–25,440 passengers cumulative. (437 Screened yesterday)
- 3. Also, 5,368 passengers have been screened at Mangalore and Karwar seaports.

**104** ArogyaSahayavani (Call center) has reserved 20 lines for receiving calls for COVID-19. Till date 14,600 calls have been received for whom necessary guidance has been provided. (Yesterday 2,145 calls received)

#### **TODAY'S UPDATES:**

- 1. Three additional ICMR VRDL labs are ready to receive and test COVID-19 samples along with existing Laboratories: NIV, Bengaluru Unit and VRDL, BMC&RI Bengaluru
  - Mysore Medical College & Research Institute (MMCRI), Mysuru
  - Hassan Institute of Medical Sciences (HIMS), Hassan
  - Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences (SIMS), Shivamogga
  - 2. Bulk SMS has been sent to all ASHA workers to create awareness regarding COVID-19 in the community
  - 3. Co-ordination meeting has been conducted chaired by Additional Chief Secretary- HFW to review contact tracing of positive cases and preparedness of isolation wards and quarantine facilities in both public and private health facilities
  - 4. Further instructions and Advisory have been issued to IT/BT companies today asking them to provide list of all employees who have travelled to COVID-19 affected countries after 21<sup>st</sup> February 2020. Also, elaborate IEC material, protocol for sanitization etc. has been explained
